WILDERNESS SCHOOL

Many great educational organizations in the past decade or two have added wilderness training to their curricula. Some examples include Outward Bound, college orientation programs, and Elderhostel travel seminars.

My impression is that these offerings fill a void once met by "vision quest" experiences like those that were a normative part of coming-of-age experiences in Inuit and Native American cultures.

We have a similar offering within the Christian culture, and it is extended to people of all ages and life stations. We call it Lent. Lent is the liturgical season when we reflect on the most challenging times in Jesus' ministry beginning with the temptations and culminating with his crucifixion.

Lent has never been the most popular season in the Christian year. Who wants to go on a journey without a map? Who wants to spend six weeks in a place without running water and groceries? Perhaps only the most outdoorsy among us.

And yet, we go—often unwillingly—to places that we would not choose to go, and we face challenges that we may prefer to avoid. We go, not so much because we are Christians, but because we are humans. We go, because challenge and deprivation are—at least to a degree and at least for a time—part of every human's experience. Virtuous and vile, prosperous and poor alike—all grapple with challenges that cut to the quick of who we are, what we value, and how we respond.

So the lessons that we take from Jesus' journey aren't about whether it's prudent to opt in or opt out. They are, instead, opportunities for self-discovery and strength training. They help us build capacity to meet greater challenges in the future. They teach us how to find nourishment in inhospitable climates. And perhaps most importantly, they remind us that we do not go it alone. Jesus has already marked the trail, and set us on this path together.

Rev. Linda Jaramillo Visits Eden

The Rev. Linda Jaramillo, Executive Minister for Justice and Witness Ministries of the United Church of Christ, was our guest preacher on Sunday, Feb. 21. Justice and Witness Ministries is the branch of the UCC National Offices that is responsible for guiding our denomination's work on human rights and social, racial, and economic justice.

In celebration of Linda's visit, Moderator Athena Guy Malloy presented her with a \$500 gift from Eden Church to help endow the Rev. Dr. Héctor E. López Scholarship for Latina and Latino UCC Seminarians. The López Scholarship is intended to prepare Latina and Latino students who are enrolled in UCC seminaries to help meet the pastoral and leadership needs of the growing Hispanic population in the UCC and our increasingly multicultural denomination, nation, and world. Dr. Lopez is the first Latino ordained in the UCC and the first Latino UCC Conference Minister in the United States. He has also been one of Linda's mentors in the ministry.

One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) is the Lenten offering of the United Church of Christ that carries God's message of love and hope to people in more than eighty countries. The 2010 OGHS theme is inspired by John 21:15-17 when Jesus asks Peter, "Do you love me?" Peter replies "Yes," and Jesus says to him, "Feed my sheep." Three times, Jesus passionately repeats his instruction, pressing his followers: If you love me, take care of the people I love.

The members of the family of God, including those in parts of the world we may never visit, are God's flock—the sheep of God's pasture (Ezekiel 34:31). Already, money donated last year is providing disaster victims in Haiti with shelter, food, clean water, and medical supplies. The recovery effort in Haiti will continue for the next five to eight years, and the UCC is in it with the people of Haiti for the long haul. Much more money is needed—not only to feed earthquake survivors, but to help the people of Haiti heal and rebuild their communities in a manner that will be more sustainable in the future.

Through our prayers, through our historic and ongoing relationships with mission partners around the globe, through our commitment to cultural education in our nation, and through our One Great Hour of Sharing Offering, we respond to Christ's call to feed the hungry and to promote sustainable agriculture in Haiti and around the world. Our OGHS offering bank cubes are currently available to anyone in the congregation and will be collected on Dedication Sunday, **Mar. 14.**

Aloha 'O Ka'ahumanu Wahine' Alii Ahuhui

Eden Church will welcome 'O Ka'ahumanu Wahine' Alii Ahuhui to worship on Sunday, **Mar. 14**. The Wahine' will sing in commemoration of Queen Ka'ahumanu's birthday, which was Mar. 17, 1768. Considered Hawai'i's first feminist, Ka'ahumanu guided the islands in a period of major transition. She was the favorite wife and most trusted advisor of Kamehameha I. After the king's death, she declared herself kuhina nui, or co-ruler, with the new king, Liholiho.

Queen Ka'ahumanu is remembered for persuading Liholiho to break the "kapus," or taboos, of native religion including those forbidding wives to share the meal table with their husbands. During her rule she oversaw the construction of the first fort at Lahaina, and established the first law code for the island of Maui.

Ka'ahumanu was baptized by Congregational missionaries, and encouraged her subjects to do the same. Kawaiaha'o Church, located in downtown Honolulu, was commissioned by the queen and frequented by the Kamehameha and Kalakaua dynasties. Founded as a Congregational Church, Kawaiaha'o Church continues its affiliation with the United Church of Christ.
