A Time in Lake Tahoe

From Sunday, Oct. 11 to Wednesday, Oct. 14 I attended the Western Christian Educators' Conference in Lake Tahoe, Nevada. A gathering for UCC, Presbyterian, and Episcopalian educators it was a time to reflect on our work within the church community. In speaking with many of you, I've already mentioned that the keynote speaker, Eric Law, was unable to attend the conference. His co-presenters Rev. Donald Schell and musician Emily Scott took the lead and were aided at the last minute by Rev. Steve Hasset. The Seekers may recognize Donald's name as he was the priest at St. Gregory's in SF when Sara Miles (author of Take this Bread) joined that church.

The conference was attended by a mix of ordained and lay people, many colleagues I knew from attending the monthly regional Youth Leader

Network meetings. I participated in four different workshops, ranging from information about "Twens" to "Seven Keys to Teaching Adults." I also participated in worship workshops. In one, I learned ways in which our congregation can expand worship to include more roles for children because their participation is one sign of a healthy and growing church.

Finally the conference stressed something that we in the UCC church already know, and that is, the idea of shared authority and shared responsibility. For we are the body of Christ, and as the body of Christ we must learn to worship and work together to be living examples of Christ's ministry. This act of being together is not without tension or change, but if God can "work with anything" so can we. For we are each called to educate, to share our gifts, and to come together to share in the work of it all. ~Liz
