Marie Plette Eco-Concert

Acclaimed soprano Marie Plette presented the fifth recital in the Eden Performing Arts Series on Sunday, Sept. 19, with her accompanist Alexander Katsman. Proceeds from her recital were donated to Save The Bay, a charity that Ms. Plette has long wanted to support, so she carefully chose a selection on green-themed songs that reflect the beauty and power of nature.

Ms. Plette began her illustrious singing career in the third grade where she created her own unique blend of Julie Andrews, Karen Carpenter, Judy Garland, and Liza Minnelli. She grew up listening to Broadway musicals with her mother and intended to focus her career on musical theater.

It was at college that “they instantly decided” Ms. Plette had to switch to opera. “My initial response was that I hated opera, but I had never listened to it. I heard my first opera in college, and I’ve been singing it ever since.” Ms. Plette graduated from the Hartt School of Music and the Julliard Opera Center, and after winning the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions in 1992, Ms. Plette was invited to make her Metropolitan debut as the first Lady in *Die Zauberflote*. She has performed frequently with the company since then.

The Eden concert featured songs about the beauty of nature. She opened with a Handel song about trees, then proceeded to selections about A Musical Garden, Night and Day, and Songs of the Sea. Ms. Plette demonstrated her amazing versatility by interspersing lighter numbers such as “It Ain’t Easy Being Green” popularized by Kermit the Frog and a jazzy arrangement of “Night and Day” by Cole Porter. As an encore, “Pollution” by Tom Lehrer brought all of the audience to their feet in a standing ovation.
